To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

Albert A. Walker, late a Private in Captain Schambless' Company, Third Regiment Tennessee Volunteers

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *his* favor, numbered *50413*

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *George Rudesel, assignee of said Albert A. Walker, and to his heirs, the East half of the North West quarter, and the West half of the North East quarter of Section Ten, in Township Eighty one North, of Range One East, in the District of Lands subject to sale, at Iowa City, Iowa: containing one hundred and sixty acres*

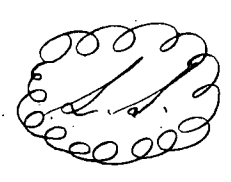
according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HOLD the said *parts of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *George Rudesel and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
