

Hauser—John George Hauser died Sunday at the home of his brother, Fred Homrighausen, who lives eight miles east of Paola. Mr. Hauser came to Paola about a year ago and has made his home with his son Fred, who is employed at the Hemenway garage, and with his brothers. He was born at Westphalia, Germany, May 12, 1848, and came to the United States in 1866. He lived first in Illinois, later in Iowa and came to Kansas in 1880. He was married after coming to this country to Anna Stines. Eight children were born, three of whom are living. Death was caused by a paralytic stroke which came Friday morning. Mr. Hauser is survived by three sons, Fred of Paola and Frank and Walton, both of Topeka, and two brothers, Fred and Henry east of town. Short services were held Tuesday morning at the Fred Hombrighausen home conducted by Rev. Mr. Albright of the Highland church. On coming to this country Mr. Hauser had his name changed from the family name of Homrighausen to Hauser while his brother retained the original name.
