

John Philip Homrighausen.

Born March 28, 1828 Died Nov. 22, '04

John Philip Homrighausen, whose death we chronicled last week, was buried in the High German cemetery Friday, followed to his last resting place by a large cortege of relatives and friends. Services were conducted by Rev. Link at the house and church.

The deceased was born March 28, 1828, at Dledenshausen, Westphalia, Prussia. He was married January 15, 1860 to Caroline Keller, and they came to this country eleven years later, settling near Whentland, where they have reared their children and lived prosperously.

To them seven sons and three daughters were born, two sons and one daughter having died some years ago. The eldest son Philip left home suddenly twenty-five years ago and it is not known whether he is living or not. The other children, Henry, John, Fred, Louis, Mrs. Louis Fox and Mrs. Fred Fox reside in this vicinity. Besides these children and an aged wife, he leaves a brother and sister in Germany, and eleven grandchildren.

Until last spring he was in apparently good health, but at that time the dread disease, dropsy, seized him, and his last days were spent in patient suffering. A man of integrity through life, he is deeply mourned by all who knew him.
