

Obituary.

The many friends of Mrs. Caroline Homrighausen were deeply grieved of her death, which occurred Wednesday, August 2, 1916, following an accident which happened the Sunday previous, in which she suffered a broken hip. Her advanced age, coupled with a tumorous growth that had affected her for some time past, and the shock of the accident too hard to withstand, and the end came as a blessed relief to her pain-racked body.

Louisa Florentine Caroline Keller was born July 26, 1835, in Diedenshausen, Westphalia, Prussia, where she spent her girlhood days and was baptized and confirmed by Rev. Florian.

She was married there to John Philip Homrighausen on January 15, 1860, and to this union nine children were born, two dying in Germany. In 1871 they came to America and settled on the farm southwest of Wheatland where they spent the remainder of their lives. Her husband died November 22, 1904, and since that time she has made her home with her children in that neighborhood.

She leaves to mourn her death 7 children, 19 grand-children and 4 great-grand-children, besides her many life-long friends and neighbors who held her in high esteem for her many kindly acts. The surviving children are Mrs. Wilhelmina Fox, Mrs. Fred Fox, Henry, John, Louis and Fred, all living in this vicinity, and one son Philip, who left home 33 years ago and has never since been heard from.

The funeral services were conducted Saturday morning at the German Reformed church by Rev. Wm. Bollman, followed by burial in St. Paul's cemetery. Her grandsons, Louis, Henry, Walter and Oscar Fox, and Edward and Elmer Homrighausen, carried her body to its final resting place.

She was a good woman, a loving wife and mother, and all will sadly miss her. May she rest in peace.
