MAN KILLED BY FALLING TIMBER

After having his skull and bones of his face crushed by a heavy timber falling from a car that was being moved on the Chicago and Northwestern railroad in the Nicolaysen Lumber yards, August Lauber, 50 years of age, died at a local hospital about 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

Lauber was in the act of following the car with a heavy block so that he could place the block under it when it stopped. Just as the car began to move one of the timbers be-

came dislodged, falling down on the worker.

Fellow workmen rushed to the injured man as he lay crumpled on the ground. He was seen to be severely hurt. Surgical aid which was provided as quickly as possible at the hospital to which he was taken was of no avail. The man never regained consciouness.

August Lauber was a German and had no relatives in this country. He had been in the employe of the Nicolaysen Lumber company for a long time.
